Mrs. Christine "Chris" Stinson, is the founder, President and CEO of Logistics Associates, LLC. Her leadership, technical prowess, and commitment to national defense began with a distinguished 20-year military career as a Chief Warrant Officer and Property Book officer. While on active-duty, her assignments included serving in the United States Army's Air Defense Brigade at Ft. Bliss, Texas; 19th Theater Support Command in the Democratic People's Republic of South Korea, 3d Infantry Division (3ID), Ft. Stewart, Georgia and numerous others. During the early years of Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF), she served as the 3d Infantry Division Property Book Officer (PBO) where she authored and implemented the United States Army Left Back Equipment (LBE) program.

Chris Stinson's private sector accomplishments include working for Honeywell at Fort Stewart as the Reports Manager for three installations. She later relocated to Northern Virginia and worked at Fort Belvoir where she worked for the Army Materiel Command and Program Managers Officer Night Vision program which supplied all the Standard Ground Station (SGS) to the Raid towers throughout Iraq and Afghanistan.

In addition to writing the Army's LBE program, used throughout the Army's roles in supporting OIF, Chris also served in the Headquarters Department of the Army, G-4 (Property Accountability and Policy Section) at the Pentagon, where she developed, staffed, and implemented policy. In the G-4, Chris spearheaded the initiative to update Army Regulation 735-5, (Property Accountability Property Accountability Policies), AR 710-2, (Supply Policy Below the National Level) and DA Pam 735-5, (Property Accountability Procedures and Financial Liability Officer's Guide). She also served on the Army's Property Accountability Task Force. Mrs. Stinson's experience in the Property Accountability have been sought and relied upon by countless senior military leaders.

Chris is spearheaded an initiative to identify cost effective solutions in asset management and asset tracking for the Department of Defense using Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) technology. The DoD currently uses RFID technology to track assets in transit and in warehouses.
